Textiles, Merchandising, and Design Handbook

The TXMD program is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges, the Tennessee Higher Education Commission, and the American Association of Family and Consumer Sciences. It is an affiliate member of the Textile and Apparel Programs Accreditation Commission.

We offer a four-year Bachelor of Science Degree in Textiles, Merchandising, and Design consisting of 120 credit hours. As with most textiles, merchandising, and design programs nationwide, **courses must be taken in a strict sequence**. Students interested in majoring in the TXMD program should declare a TXMD major with a concentration in either Apparel Design or Fashion Merchandising before progressing in the TXMD upper-division coursework. Upon successfully completing the TXMD coursework in Apparel Design or Fashion Merchandising, students will earn a Bachelor of Science in Textiles, Merchandising, and Design.

## **Apparel Design Concentration**

Apparel Design blends a flair for fashion with practical knowledge. Students with a talent for drawing and creating clothing can apply their creativity in classes designed to expand their knowledge of the billion-dollar fashion industry. Students who choose this concentration should be tech-savvy and ready to learn 3D design technologies in the classroom.

## **Fashion Merchandising Concentration**

Fashion Merchandising prepares students for the fast-paced, rapidly expanding, and exciting world of the garment industry. This concentration emphasizes the business functions of the promotion and sale of fashions in the retail sector and synchronization with the design, production, and retail functions in the manufacturing sector of the fashion industry. Students who choose this concentration should be tech-savvy and have business acumen.

The TXMD Program requires the four pre-requisite courses before taking upper-division coursework. You must earn a grade of "C" (2.00) or better in all TXMD pre-requisite courses to progress in the TXMD Program.

# TXMD Pre-Requisite Courses

- VCOM 2950 Visual Communication Application
- TXMD 1110 Apparel Foundations Applications
- TXMD 1170 Introduction to the Fashion Industry
- TXMD 2180/2181 Textiles I

## Progression in TXMD Upper-Division Coursework

- Students in the Apparel Design Concentration may take TXMD 3200 concurrently while taking the TXMD Pre-requisite courses of VCOM 2950, TXMD 1110, TXMD 1170, and TXMD 2180/81 to facilitate timely progression in the program.
- Students must have no grade less than a C in the TXMD Pre-Requisite course before registering for the TXMD upper division courses. This includes ACCT 3000 as a pre-requisite for TXMD 3450.
- Students must attain a minimum grade of C (2.00) in all TXMD courses.
- Students may repeat a TXMD course only once to earn a minimum grade of C (2.00). This includes TXMD 1110, TXMD 1170, and TXMD 2180/81.
- Students may repeat a maximum of 2 TXMD courses.
- If a student receives a D or F in a TXMD course at MTSU, he/she must repeat that course at MTSU.

- Students will be dismissed from the TXMD major if they:
  - Commit a breach of ethics or gross professional negligence.
  - Fail to progress due to unsuccessful attainment of requirements.
  - For transfer students who are admitted into the TXMD program, a grade of D or F from another school counts as the first "failing" attempt. The next incidence of D or F, in TXMD Pre-Requisite Courses or in any other TXMD courses, counts as the second incident, thus resulting in the inability to progress in the program.

TXMD students are assigned a College of Behavioral and Health Sciences Academic Advisor based on their declared major. It is recommended that you schedule an appointment with your major advisor during each semester to stay on track with the degree requirements of the TXMD program.

 Apparel Design majors and students taking Apparel Design courses must purchase sewing supplies. This one-time cost for sewing supplies is approximately \$80 and will be used throughout all design courses. Additionally, students will purchase fabric and supplies to construct their garments in these courses. Costs will vary based on each student's existing sewing supplies and choice of fabrics and materials for each project. • It is recommended that Apparel Design students have or purchase a sewing machine before taking TXMD 3300 Apparel Construction II. Time requirements to complete projects deem outside class work imperative for success in completing quality work.

### TXMD Minor:

The Textiles, Merchandising, and Design Program also offers a TXMD minor. Students may declare a minor in Textiles, Merchandising, and Design by specifying a concentration in either Apparel Design or Fashion Merchandising.

TXMD minors must complete the pre-requisite courses of TXMD 1110, TXMD 1170, and TXMD 2180/81. However, students for the TXMD minor do not have to take VCOM 2950 Computer Application Foundation unless it is a pre-requisite to a TXMD course they have chosen. TXMD minors must earn a grade of C (2.0) or higher in all TXMD courses.
